About STUBE

The supplementary study programme for students from Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe and Latin America, **STUBE** for short, is offered in eleven federal states and regions. **STUBE** is financed by the Protestant Church and with public funds.

- supplements subject-specific studies at German universities by extramural offerings that are oriented towards concepts of Global Learning and Education for Sustainable Development.
- is geared towards students from Africa, Asia, Latin America and Eastern Europe.
- is participatory, interdisciplinary and interreligious.
- allows students to become sensitized and qualified with respect to development issues and supports them in being actors of the transformation towards a world society that is more ecological and more socially just.
- STUBE topics are closely related to the 2030 Agenda of the United Nations and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). In addition, the STUBE branches offer opportunities to international students for enhancing their potential and their skills and for orientation in planning for the future.
- is active in Baden-Württemberg, Bavaria, Berlin, Brandenburg, Bremen, Hamburg, Hesse, Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, Lower Saxony, North Rhine-Westphalia, Rhineland-Palatinate, Saarland, Saxony, Saxony-Anhalt, Schleswig-Holstein and Thuringia.

STUBE offers

Weekend seminars, summer academies, workshops

On weekends or over a longer time period, we take a closer look at topics in development policy, e.g. from the areas of economy, globalization, development policy, technologies, health, gender, environment, agriculture, food, human rights, religions, political systems and cultural diversity. The (informal) exchange at the events provides ample space for networking and intercultural learning.

Multiplier training

Some STUBE branches offer a multiplier programme. Here, students train as ambassadors for a more just and sustainable world. The training focuses on topics that make the connection between the global South and the North visible. Upon completion of the training, the students receive a certificate and are deployed as multipliers in schools, universities and church communities.

Vocational internships and study visits

STUBE's programme of vocational internships and study visits (BPSA) covers the travel costs for a study visit or an internship in the region of origin. The students can test the knowledge they gained from their studies in practice in their region of origin. This is also an opportunity to establish contacts to potential employers and thus facilitate successful reintegration.

Local activities on the ground

The programme supports students financially and organizationally in offering events at the university sites. The students speak about their countries and present current developments in direct dialogue with the public.

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
